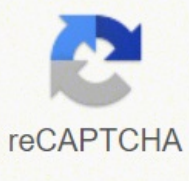

Transitive and Intransitive Verbs

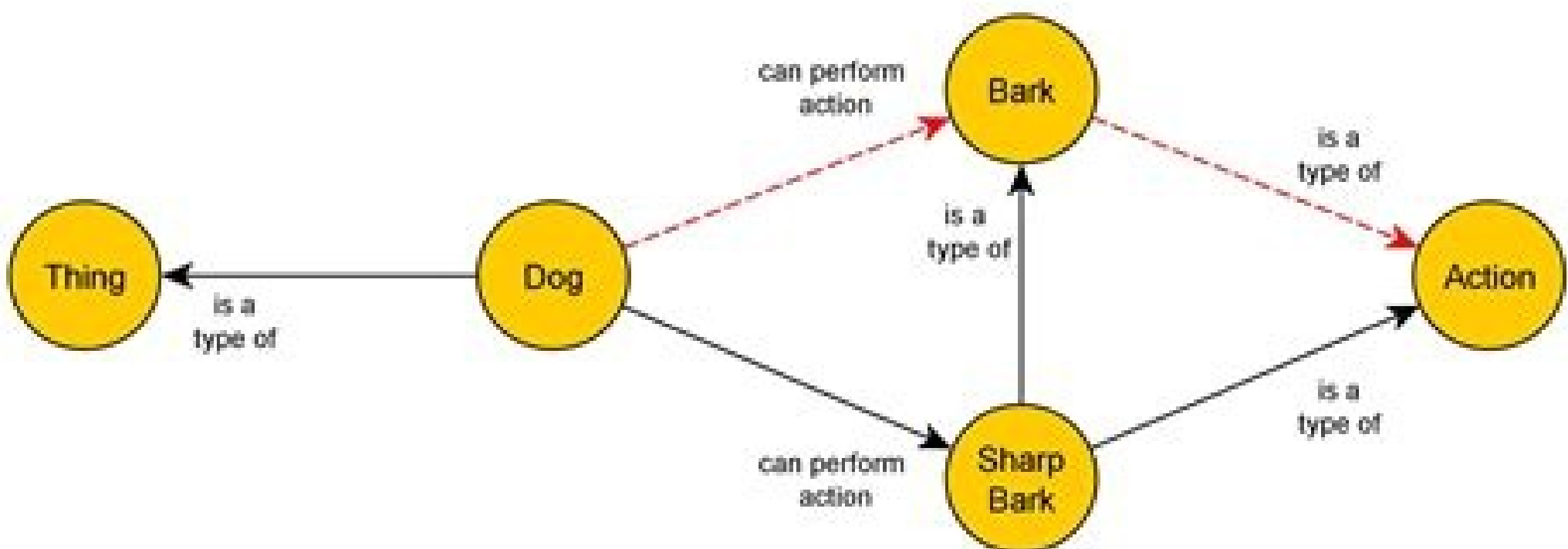
A transitive verb is an action verb that is accompanied by a direct object. An intransitive verb does not require a direct object.
